Ad 1) Opening of the meeting and approval of the agenda

Prof. Ondrej Blažo, on behalf of the Dean of the PraF UK welcomed all those present and, after verification of attendance, it was established that the Study Programme Board of "Law and International Law" (hereinafter also referred to as the "Study Programme Board" or the "SPB") is quorate (8 members of the Study Programme Board present out of a total of 8).

The staff responsible for the agenda of development and quality at both faculties, namely Dr. Gabani for the PraF UzhNU and Dr. Meteňkanyč for the PraF UK.

Until election of the Chairman of the SPB, the meeting was chaired by Prof. Ondrej Blažo.

Furthermore, prof. Ondrej Blažo stated that, pursuant to the internal regulations of Comenius University and the Faculty of Law of Comenius University Bratislava, the Study Programme Board is quorate if more than a half of all its members is present, while the members of the Study Programme Board adopt resolutions by a simple majority of the votes of the members present.

Following this, prof. Blažo presented to the members of the Study Programme Board the proposed agenda of the meeting and put it to a vote.

Resolution No. 1 – approval of the meeting agenda

Voting on the agenda of the meeting of the Study Programme Board of "Law and International Law":

in favour 8, against 0, abstentions 0.

Prof. Blažo stated that the agenda of the meeting of the Study Programme Board was approved by Resolution No. 1 in the proposed wording.

Ad 2) Election of the chairman

At the beginning of item 2 of the meeting of the Study Programme Board, prof. Blažo presented the composition of the Study Programme Board of "Law and International Law". He added that the members of the Study Programme Board were appointed in accordance with the internal regulations of Comenius University in Bratislava (hereinafter also referred to as "CU").

Subsequently, prof. Blažo initiated the election of the Chairman of the Study Programme Board of the study programme "Law and International Law" in the combination of fields of study 30. Law and D9 International Law, at the bachelor's level of study, in full-time form, conducted in the English language (ENbPMP26). At the same time, he pointed out that the duties of guarantors and co-guarantors arise from the internal regulations of CU.

Following a joint discussion, the members of the Study Programme Board proposed prof. Turošík as the Chairman of the Study Programme Board and prof. Karabin supported this choice.

Following the above, prof. Blažo put to a vote the election of the Chairman of the Study Programme Board of "Law and International Law" (ENbPMP26).





Resolution No. 2 – election of the Chairman of the Study Programme Board of “Law and International Law” (ENbPMP26)

Voting on the election of the Chairman of the Study Programme Board of “Law and International Law” (ENbPMP26) – prof. Turošík:

in favour 7, against 0, abstentions 1.

Prof. Turošík stated that he had been elected as the Chairman of the Study Programme Board of “Law and International Law” (ENbPMP26) and thanked those present for their trust and the remaining part of the meeting was chaired by prof. Turošík.

Ad 3) Preparation of the documentation of the study programme “Law and International Law”

The Chairman of the Study Programme Board, after an introductory presentation of the agenda item, gave the floor to prof. Blažo, who presented the proposed description of the study programme, in particular the basic starting points for the creation of the graduate profile and the presentation of the profile courses (as well as the presentation of which persons were designated as those responsible for the profile courses). He also presented the draft study plan and the internal evaluation report, including all their specific features. All members of the Study Programme participated in the preparation of the new study programme, namely the guarantors, co-guarantors, the student representative, and the representative of employers from the relevant field of education, in close cooperation with the relevant departments of both faculties – the PraF UzhNU and PraF UK. It must be noted that the preparation of the programme started already before signing the formal agreement between the universities and appointment the SPB via informal contacts and consultation within the ambit of Memorandum of Cooperation signed between the faculties and the preparation of the programme continued via exchange of e-mails.

The members of the Study Programme Board unanimously declared that the proposed study programme, the proposed description of the study programme, the draft study plan, and other prepared materials are in compliance with Article 33(2) and (3) of Internal Regulation No. 3/2026, approved by the Academic Senate of Comenius University Bratislava, being the consolidated version of Regulation No. 23/2021 – Internal Quality Assurance System of Higher Education at Comenius University Bratislava, as amended by Addenda No. 1 to 5 (hereinafter referred to as the “IQAS”).

Subsequently, a discussion took place among all present members of the Study Programme Board as to whether the submitted documentation of the proposed study programme, including all its annexes, meets the requirements for such a proposal, as required by Article 33(2) and (3) of the IQAS.

Afterwards, prof. Turošík invited those present to submit proposals for amendments to the submitted documents.

Owing to fact that the quality of research of prof Turošík, doc. Burdová and doc. Andraško has been recently vetted for the purpose of PhD study programmes and in the case of prof. Turošík and doc. Burdová also for the purpose of the procedure of appointment of professors by the Accreditation Council of Comenius University Bratislava, i.e. internationally recognized level has been confirmed, there is no doubt that they fulfil also the lower standard required for the first degree programme.

The list of research activities of prof. Karabin, prof. Buletsa and prof. Mendzhul provide examples of research published in foreign journals in English and thus their research was also tested in the non-Ukrainian environment.

Therefore, the SPB unanimously concluded, that the persons guaranteeing the programme without any doubts submitted 15 research outcomes at least with a quality "at least at a nationally recognized level "

All teachers involved in the programme have submitted their scientific and pedagogical characteristics via AIS2.





The representative of students: *Mgr. Bronislava Ondrejová* raised no further comments during the meeting.

The representative of employers *Mgr. Lukáš Štefánik, LL.M.*, has submitted on behalf of Soukeník-Štrbka Law Firm written support for the programme.

At the conclusion of the discussion, the members of the Study Programme Board reached a unanimous consensus with regard to the content of the individual materials, which they expressed by voting on the resolution set out in item 4 of these minutes.

Ad 4) Approval of the submission of the proposal of the study programme to the Accreditation Council of the Faculty of Law of Comenius University Bratislava

Following the conclusion of the discussion, the Chairman of the Study Programme Board submitted for consideration the proposal for approval of the submission of the study programme to the Accreditation Council of the Faculty of Law of Comenius University in Bratislava and put the draft resolution to a vote.

Prof. Turošík stated that the draft description of the study programme, the internal evaluation report and other prepared materials of the study programme "*Law and International Law*" had been approved.

Ad 5) Miscellaneous

The Chairman of the Study Programme Board subsequently opened the agenda item "Miscellaneous", under which prof. Blažo took the floor and stated that, in the near future, a minor linguistic revision of the approved documents will be carried out in order to ensure an adequate grammatical standard, as certain documents were prepared using automated translation and it is possible that selected typographical errors and technical deficiencies will be corrected. However, these will not constitute substantive changes.

Ad 6) Conclusions

At the very conclusion, prof. Turošík thanked those present for their participation, wished everyone a peaceful Easter holiday (for some this week, for others the following week), and closed the meeting of the Study Programme Board.
