## 2. PURPOSE OF THE COURSE

The **purpose** of studying the discipline "Microeconomics" is to master the theoretical foundations and skills of analysis of processes and trends in interstate economic communication, as well as helps students to understand the basics of microeconomic processes and comprehend international economic, the main tools and conditions of their implementation in the context of profound structural changes taking place today.

The main **objectives** of the discipline are:

- to acquaint students with the conceptual basics of microeconomics;
- to develop students' understanding of the essence of microeconomics basic relations, their forms, principles and laws by which they develop;
- to highlight the conditions in which microeconomics develop, to show the environment of their development;
- to outline the patterns and forms of world integration processes;
- to teach students the ability to creatively analyze the microeconomic data, to determine the place of the economy of a particular country, the level of its foreign economic activity;
- to teach students not only to freely interpretive of microeconomic processes, but also to anticipate their further development.

According to the educational program, the study of the discipline contributes to the formation of higher education in the following competencies:

- understanding the essence of microeconomic relations and the relationship of their forms, subjects and levels;
- ability to analyze and evaluate the economic, political and legal aspects of microeconomics;
